

BUILDING FOUNDATIONS

A. What is Building Foundations?

1. This is a New Believers class for kids who have accepted Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.
2. This is also used as a Christian 101 class for kids as they grow in the Lord.

1 Corinthians 3:11

“For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ.”

B. Starting a New Believers Class

1. The first thing to do is pray! Those of you who already have a New Believers class know how important this is and that you need to continue to lift this in prayer. (1 Thessalonians 5:17 “Pray without ceasing”)
2. Decide when you will have your class, how many weeks it will be, who will teach the classes, what you will teach.
3. Decide on how you will let the kids and parents know about your New Believers Class.
 - a. Flyers.
 - b. Letters to the parents.
 - c. Put New Believers sign up cards in each room.
 - d. Make a simple sign-up sheet for parents to sign up their kids.
 - e. Online advertising with online sign-ups.
 - f. Use your creativity to create special graphics describing the class.
 - g. We use these sign-up sheets for special events like VBS, Easter, Christmas, Kids Camp, Thanksgiving, etc.
 - h. During these special events, the kids have an opportunity to accept Jesus as Lord and Savior, if they accept Jesus as Lord and Savior, they are directed to the New Believers sign up table where the parents sign up their child for the class. Also, we provide information for the parents if they have any questions.
 - i. Make phone calls and send emails to the parents to remind them of the upcoming class.

C. Teaching the Class

1. Depending on how many weeks your class is and what basic fundamentals you want to teach, that will help guide you in teaching the class.
 - a. We use 10 lessons broken down into 4 weeks. (Lessons are in the handout)
 - **Week 1 • Lesson 1-4** (Crawling)
 - #1 A New Relationship (John 10:9)

“I am the door. If anyone enters by Me, he will be saved, and will go in and out and find pasture.”
 - #2 Growing by Leaps and Bounds (Proverbs 2:1-5)

- **Week 3 • Lessons 7-8** (Running Part 1)
 - #7 Water Baptism and Communion (Matthew 26:26-29 and Acts 8:26-39)

Matthew 26:26-29 “And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, ‘Take, eat; this is My body.’ Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, ‘Drink from it, all of you. For this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins. But I say to you, I will not drink of this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it new with you in My Father’s kingdom.’”

Acts 8:26-39 “Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning at this Scripture, preached Jesus to him. Now as they went down the road, they came to some water. And the eunuch said, ‘See, here is water. What hinders me from being baptized?’ Then Philip said, ‘If you believe with all your heart, you may.’ And he answered and said, ‘I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.’ So he commanded the chariot to stand still. And both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water, and he baptized him. Now when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord caught Philip away, so that the eunuch saw him no more; and he went on his way rejoicing.”
 - #8 Baptism of the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:4-8)

“And being assembled together with them, He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father, ‘which,’ He said, ‘you have heard from Me; for John truly baptized with

water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.' Therefore, when they had come together, they asked Him, saying, 'Lord, will You at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?' And He said to them, 'It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has put in His own authority. But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.'"

▪ **Week 4 • Lessons 9-10** (Running Part 2)

○ #9 Body Ministry: Using your gifts (Romans 12:4-12)

"For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another. Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, let us prophesy in proportion to our faith; or ministry, let us use it in our ministering; he who teaches, in teaching; he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness. Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is evil. Cling to what is good. Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another; not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord; rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in prayer;"

○ #10 The Hope of His Coming (1 Thessalonians 5:1-23)

"But concerning the times and the seasons, brethren, you have no need that I should write to you. For you yourselves know perfectly that the day of the Lord so comes as a thief in the night. For when they say, 'Peace and safety!' then sudden destruction comes upon them, as labor pains upon a pregnant woman. And they shall not escape. But you, brethren, are not in darkness, so that this Day should overtake you as a thief. You are all sons of light and sons of the day. We are not of the night nor of darkness. Therefore let us not sleep, as others do, but let us watch and be sober. For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk are drunk at night. But let us who are of the day be sober, putting on the breastplate of faith and love, and as a helmet the hope of salvation. For God did not appoint us to wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, that whether we wake or sleep, we should live together with Him. Therefore comfort each other and edify one another, just as you also are doing. And we urge you, brethren, to recognize those who labor among you, and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, and to esteem them very highly in love for their work's sake. Be at peace

among yourselves. Now we exhort you, brethren, warn those who are unruly, comfort the fainthearted, uphold the weak, be patient with all. See that no one renders evil for evil to anyone, but always pursue what is good both for yourselves and for all. Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. Do not quench the Spirit. Do not despise prophecies. Test all things; hold fast what is good. Abstain from every form of evil. Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely; and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be preserved blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.”

- b. These are the ten lessons we use. You can also use these as a Christian 101 class (10 weeks long) and give a more in-depth teaching on each theme.
- c. Be creative when you teach.
 - Use props.
 - Play games.
 - Get parents involved.
 - Give homework to the parents and tell them to sit with their kids and do the homework together.
 - Ask them to bring back the homework.
 - Do a question-and-answer time with the kids.
2. Give out completion certificates at the end of the 4-week week class.
3. Love on these kids, pray for them and watch them grow you never know which one could be your next Pastor!

John 10:9

LESSON BACKGROUND

So, you've accepted Christ, now what? Your heart is filled with joy, and you're excited about your new life in Christ, but just what does that mean? Well, to begin with, you've got a new friend and constant companion who will be with you for the rest of your life. John 10:9 says, "I am the door. If anyone enters by Me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture." You've entered through the door that is Jesus Christ. Because you've accepted His death on the cross as a payment for your sins, you've been saved, and now you have a new relationship with God that only someone who is born-again can have! You now have the ability to go in and out of that door and find pasture. Finding pasture in Christ means finding peace, comfort, direction, and purpose in His presence. Just like any good friend, you can visit with your Savior anytime you'd like. He's available for you whenever you need Him, and you can always talk to Him through prayer.

Prayer is how you communicate with your new friend. It's how you can say thank you and share your problems with Him. Also, it is how He can talk with you. Do you remember when you first met your best friend? You know that special little girl or boy that you met at school or church with whom you just loved spending time? Remember how you just couldn't wait to see and talk to him? Well, now that you have a new relationship with Christ, it's going to feel the same way, but you don't have to wait to talk to Him. Even though you can't see Him, He's always there. In Matthew 28:20, He tells us that He will be with us always, even to the end of the age. Christ is like no other friend you've ever had. He will never leave you, betray you, give you bad advice, or stop loving you. You are the most precious person to Him, and He wants to develop this new relationship even more than you do!

The most wonderful thing about your new relationship with Christ is that developing it won't be hard. You don't have to try to figure out who God is or what He expects of you because He left you all the instructions you need in the Bible. The more you fill your heart and mind with God's word the more you'll know who He is and how much He loves you. By praying and reading your Bible, you'll develop your relationship with Him and learn to hear His still small voice telling you which way you should go.

God has given you many spiritual blessings, as a Christian, that you can now begin to realize if you keep Jesus as the center of your life. When you obey His directions, you are in His will, causing you to be at peace with Him and everyone else. Remember that all scripture is given by inspiration of God and in these verses, you will find out what God desires for you. These are His letters to you. Pray that you'll understand more and more of His council. Be in fellowship with other Christians and tell all your friends about Jesus and what He has done for you.

What hinders me from being baptized?’ Then Philip said, ‘If you believe with all your heart, you may.’ And he answered and said, ‘I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.’ So he commanded the chariot to stand still. And both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water, and he baptized him. Now when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord caught Philip away, so that the eunuch saw him no more; and he went on his way rejoicing.”
- **Lesson Aim:** Teach the children the importance of water baptism and communion.

Lesson #8 – Baptism of the Holy Spirit

- **Acts 1:4-8**, “And being assembled together with them, He commanded them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the Promise of the Father, ‘which,’ He said, ‘you have heard from Me; for John truly baptized with water, but you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now.’ Therefore, when they had come together, they asked Him, saying, ‘Lord, will You at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?’ And He said to them, ‘It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has put in His own authority. But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.’”
- **Lesson Aim:** Point out that Jesus gives us the Holy Spirit to empower us for Christian living and for service.

Lesson # 9 – Body Ministry

- **Romans 12:4-12**, “For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another. Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, let us prophesy in proportion to our faith; or ministry, let us use it in our ministering; he who teaches, in teaching; he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness. Let love be without hypocrisy. Abhor what is evil. Cling to what is good. Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another; not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord; rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in prayer;”
- **Lesson Aim:** Help the children understand that we, as God’s children, are all members of one body who work together in ministry to serve the Lord.

Lesson #10 – The Hope of His Coming

- **1 Thessalonians 5:1-23**, “But concerning the times and the seasons, brethren, you have no need that I should write to you. For you yourselves know perfectly that the day of the Lord so comes as a thief in the night. For when they say, ‘Peace and safety!’ then sudden destruction comes upon them, as labor pains upon a pregnant woman. And they shall not escape. But you, brethren, are not in darkness, so that this Day should overtake you as a thief. You are all sons of light and sons of the day. We are not of the night nor of darkness. Therefore let us not sleep, as others do, but let us watch and be sober. For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk are drunk at night. But let us who are of the day be sober, putting on the breastplate of faith and love, and as a helmet the hope of salvation. For God did not appoint us to wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died

for us, that whether we wake or sleep, we should live together with Him. Therefore comfort each other and edify one another, just as you also are doing. And we urge you, brethren, to recognize those who labor among you, and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, and to esteem them very highly in love for their work's sake. Be at peace among yourselves. Now we exhort you, brethren, warn those who are unruly, comfort the fainthearted, uphold the weak, be patient with all. See that no one renders evil for evil to anyone, but always pursue what is good both for yourselves and for all. Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. Do not quench the Spirit. Do not despise prophecies. Test all things; hold fast what is good. Abstain from every form of evil. Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely; and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be preserved blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.”

- **Lesson Aim:** As Christian we are given Scripture showing how we are to lead our lives while waiting for the return of Jesus for His church.


